Graham McMahon, MD, MMSc, is the President and CEO of the ACCME. Previously he was an associate dean and associate professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School, and program director for the fellowship program in the division of endocrinology, diabetes and hypertension at the Brigham & Women's Hospital in Boston where he completed his postgraduate training. Dr. McMahon received his medical education at the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, a master's degree in clinical research from Harvard Medical School, and his doctorate in education from the National University of Ireland. He was the editor for medical education at the New England Journal of Medicine for more than 10 years. He has received local and national awards for his teaching and his work in medical education and diabetes research. His work has been published in the New England Journal of Medicine, Diabetes Care, the Archives of Internal Medicine, the Journal of General Internal Medicine, and Medical Education. Currently at the ACCME He leads efforts to leverage the power of accredited CME to address national and international healthcare challenges. In collaboration with ACCME's governance, he oversees initiatives to fulfill ACCME's mission and vision by setting standards for education that accelerate learning, change, and growth in healthcare; and by sustaining a framework that supports, inspires, and motivates educators to achieve their full potential.

Dame Jane Elizabeth Dacre is Emeritus Professor of Medical Education at University College London and a practicing rheumatologist. In the 2018 Birthday Honours, she was appointed a Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire (DBE) for services to medicine and medical education.
